

## Parent Concerns during COVID

What precautions will be taken to ensure my child's safety? How many children will be in each class?
What options will Central Elementary School and Central High School offer?
I do not have internet. How will my child learn?
Will mask be provided?
Will staff wear mask?
Who will take temperatures of my student as she enters the school?
Will High School teachers wear mask?
How will desk be partitioned off?
How will students receive their lessons online?
I would love to see kids back in school with perhaps some online learning.
What would the rules be with the kids attending school?
I plan to send her to school next year unless the guidelines and requirements are too much.
What are the guidelines that the school will be following in regards to any CDC or State superintendent recommendations, such as students required to wear masks, eating lunch/snacks in classroom, no P.E., partitions in classrooms, etc?
The concerns I have with a traditional environment will be the restrictions in place for the students. I would like to see some sort of hybrid with at home virtual learning as well as in classroom instruction if possible, perhaps alternating through the week.
Need to know what traditional school will be like. My concern is all the recommendations they put out recently about wearing masks, spacing kids out, no lunchroom usage, no playground, no field trips, etc ... Also need to know the calendar and school start/end times. Also need to know what virtual school will be like. Who will teach it? Will the times be flexible? What platform will be used?
This is a big decision. We'd like to know what traditional school will look like for him. Would he be required to wear a mask? Would he be permitted to participate in PE, Music and Library Activities? Would he be required to eat lunch in the classroom? Would time be permitted for him to play outside on the playground? We'd like to make the best and most informed decision before we commit to online or traditional school at this time.
What guidelines are being required to follow for traditional classroom learning?
We are opting for traditional but feel that we have a lot of questions from safety to extracurricular activities but assume the school is working through these issues. Main reason for choosing traditional - feel the quality of education online is not adequate.
What are the safety measures that will be put in place to keep students 6 feet away?
How will things work with band and other extra-curricular activities if she has classes from home? I'd this option being offered to reduce the number of children in the school or because you feel the schools will be closed again?
We would like to know what e-learning would look like for her before we are able to say which we prefer. Is she will be attending a traditional class via zoom, or will it look more like an online college course.
It would be nice for there to be an option of virtual learning or something similar when the students are too sick to go to school or has been sick & still not feeling well. My child (& my older 2) have asthma & have a hard time getting over respiratory infections.
My daughter is devastated. She has waited for years to finally be a senior. Now she is forced to this type of year. She couldn't watch her friends graduate a normal graduation. We are undecided at this time. She is considering a traditional classroom experience but she thinks it is pointless if it's only one teacher. And the desks will be 4 feet apart and masks on at all times. Don't get her wrong making sure that germs are not spread is important but it won't ever be a normal experience when it keeps getting shoved in your face. While, on the other hand virtual learning is nice but what if the student never wakes up. Or they never get their hours or socialization, the computer crashes all these different problems.
How will social distancing be practiced and will there still be sports like band or football

We will make a determination closer to the reopening of school. My decision will be based on increase or decrease of COVID 19.
How will you keep children from coming in contact with the covid? Will y'all have computer learning and clean them after each class ?
Is my child going to be required to wear a mask during school hours.
How will Social Distancing be accomplished? Will school lunches be available? Will students and teachers be required to wear masks? How many students will be in each classroom! Will there be any checks done such as temperature reading? How will the virtual learning be done, will the teachers be available to assist, will there be any online instruction done by the teachers? Can the students switch to traditional classroom if they start virtual and vice versa?
It would depend on the threat at that time. I feel that it is vitally important that children of this age have social interaction with their peers. I believe this benefits not just their academics but also their growth as individuals in society. I think these things have to be weighed with the circumstances presented during the school year. Would the choice be for the whole school year or just when needed?
Will PE be cancelled for traditional school? Will kids be required to wear masks at school? Will online school be like the last nine weeks of last school was, or more structure What happens if my work schedule changes and I need to change my child back to traditional after choosing online? Will teachers be teaching online and traditional students or will they have teachers specific to traditional classes and teachers specific to online classes?
What precautions will be taken if school does open back up
What are the virus numbers in our area at that time? Will my child have to wear a mask all day?
If the COVID cases are high with known positive exposures at school then we will opt for virtual classroom. If low COVID cases present and the students and faculty adhere to strict guidelines to prevent spread, we will go with traditional learning.
Will they be going to school for the whole day or a half a day. out some days and the remainder of the time online?
I'm concerned that if my child do traditional she may become infected with covid-19 and if she do virtual she won't receive the best quality of learning, so as of now I'm undecided.
What precautions are being taken in the classroom and throughout the campus to keep the children safe? Is masking going to be mandatory throughout the day?
I would like to have both options available. I would like my child to have that traditional school with virtual. So with a 2 day in-school and 3 day home school would be great. Having that peer to peer interaction would be great. I will know more based off of the conditions of the state and this area COVID-19 status.
My son has asthma and will not be able to wear a mask for a long period of time; however, he is under an IEP and will need assistance with learning. I feel I'm having to choose my son's health over proper education services.
If my child has to wear a mask full time I will probably want to go the virtual learning route.
